


Likelihood of working for free

Did/do you work for free as a volunteer or unpaid intern while pursuing your career in conservation?





Did/do you work for free as a volunteer or unpaid intern while pursuing your career in conservation?






Time spent working for free

If 'Yes', how many months would you estimate you worked for free over the course of your career path as a conservationist?





If 'Yes', how many months would you estimate you worked for free over the course of your career path as a conservationist?




Need to take on a second job

Did you ever have to take a second job to afford a career in conservation?



Did you ever have to take a second job to afford a career in conservation?





Conservationists agree that a career in conservation requires privilege








What is your age?


What is your gender identity?


What is your racial and ethnic identity?


