SUMMARY

OBJECTIVES

- Students play a BINGO game as they listen to interviews from diverse wildlife conservationists talking about how they do their work, the challenges they have overcome, and what gives them hope for the future.
- Students understand what wildlife conservation means and can give examples of different types of wildlife conservationists and the tools they use for their work.

INSTRUCTIONS

This lesson is taught by Shawna, the narrator in our video! All you need to do is give each student or pair of students the two-page worksheet and a BINGO card and have them follow along with the video. About 13 minutes into the video, Shawna explains how to use the BINGO cards and worksheet, so you may want to start the video first and then pass out the materials to save time.

TIPS:

- \Rightarrow Having students work in pairs for this lesson makes it more fun and takes off the pressure of filling out the worksheet and simultaneously checking off the BINGO card.
- ⇒ Consider breaking this into two or even three shorter sessions and seeing how many times each team/pair can score a "BINGO."
