Antlers: pair of bony, branched structures found on the heads of adult deer Beaver dam: structure built by beavers to block or slow the flow of water in a stream or river Carnivore: animal that eats meat Echolocation: process used by bats to find their way in the dark by producing sound waves that echo, or are heard again, when they are reflected off an object **Extinction:** the permanent disappearance of a species from Earth Fact: something that is known or proved to be true Fiction: something that is invented or untrue Fungus: organism that is a member of the Kingdon Fungi, which includes yeasts, mildews, molds, and mushrooms Hatch: emerge from an egg Horn: hard, permanent outgrowths on the heads of most hoofed animals such as cattle, sheep, goats, bison, and rhinos Howl: loud, sustained sound made by wolves to communicate with one another Mammal: type of warm-blooded vertebrate animal that has hair and feeds their young with milk produced by the mother Marsupial: type of mammal whose young complete their development in a pouch on the mother's abdomen Rattles: series of hollow scales at the end of a rattlesnake's tail that make a buzzing sound **Recognize:** identify as something or someone previously seen Reject: refuse to accept Rodents: mammals characterized by a pair of front teeth that grow continuously and are used to gnaw their food Species: a category of living things that are capable of interbreeding Temperature: measure of hotness or coldness Urban myth: a story that many people believe is true but is not Venomous: able to produce poison Warts: fleshy growths on the skin caused by a virus Wild: living or growing in a natural environment
